<p style="text-align: center;"><u>REFERENDUM ORDINANCE</u></p> <p>Ordinance No. 20-004: A Referendum Ordinance of the Voters of the City of Palmer Repealing Palmer Municipal Code Chapter 5.32 Marijuana Businesses, Prohibiting the Operation of Marijuana Cultivation Facilities, Marijuana Manufacturing Facilities, Marijuana Testing Facilities, and Retail Marijuana Stores Pursuant to AS 17.38.110 Local Control, but Not Restricting Industrial Hemp as Defined Herein.</p> <p>Ordinance No. 20-004 would repeal PMC 5.32 and allow marijuana businesses in the City of Palmer. Effective date would be at the certification of the election, which is scheduled for October 12, 2020.</p> <p>PROPOSITION NO. <p>AMENDMENT OF THE PALMER CITY CHARTER, CHAPTER III, SECTION 3.2 Terms of Office</p> <p>Shall Chapter III, Section 3.2 of the Charter of the City of Palmer be amended to read as follows (new language is <u>underlined</u> and bolded and deleted language is stricken and [bracketed]):</p> <p>Section 3.2 Terms of office. The terms of two councilmen shall expire each year, except that in each third year, counting from 1963, the terms of the Mayor and of two Councilmen shall expire. When appointments are made to fill vacancies in the manner provided by Section 2.13(a) of this Charter, appointees shall qualify for and assume the duties of office within ten days after appointment, unless such time be extended for not more than sixty days by the Council. <u>A person serving as a council member may not serve for more than two consecutive, full terms without a break in service for at least one full year. No member of the council shall serve more than four consecutive terms, as the mayor and a council member, without a break in service for at least one full year. Years of service of an appointee filling a vacated seat does not count toward the total term limit.</u></p> <p>PROPOSITION NO. P-3 <input type="radio"/> Yes <input type="radio"/> No</p>	<p>UTILITY REVENUE BONDS FOR WASTEWATER UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS</p> <p>Shall the City of Palmer incur utility revenue bonded indebtedness and issue utility revenue bonds in the principal amount not to exceed Eight Million Dollars (\$8,000,000.00) to finance capital improvements to the City's wastewater utility facilities and pay costs of issuance of such bonds?</p> <p>The bonds shall be paid from wastewater utility revenues. The bonds shall not be a general obligation of the City, and neither the full faith or credit nor the taxing power of the City shall be pledged to the payment of the principal or of interest on the bonds.</p> <p>PROPOSITION NO.
