- 1. Runway 16/34 Repaving and Shoulder Surfacing.
- 2. Object Free Area Improvements (earthwork, clearing and grubbing, tree topping, sign relocation).
- 3. Runway Safety Area Expansion.
- 4. Taxiway B Spot Repairs.
- 5. Large Aircraft Apron Expansion, Phase 1.
- 6. Re-mark crosswind to Runway 10/28.




Figure: Rehabilitate Runway 16/34 & Related Improvements
