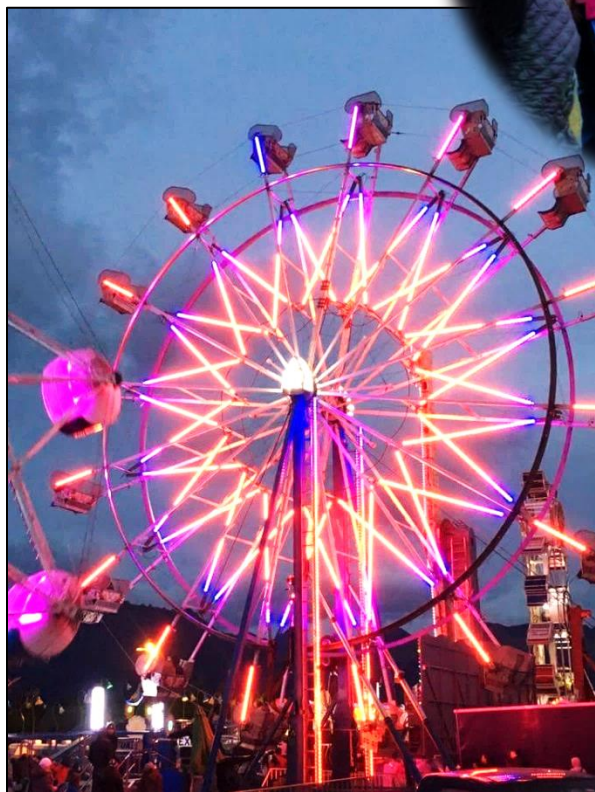
Palmer Welcomed the Alaska State Fair
