wonderful accomplishment girls! Steve MacSwain believes that success like this can be inspirational and can even open the doors to play College Hockey or in future Olympics.




competed in the games. The Palmer MTA Events Center was the place to be as the parking lot was full and the stands were packed with many excited fans. Colony High School won the Championship.


