atmosphere and community spirit were evident at the Noodle Chute brought to Palmer by Saroma Kai and was accompanied by live music, free hotdogs and cake, all



Let's take a peek at the airport and ask Frank Kelly what has happened around the airport since April of this year. On May 31st the Warren "Bud" Woods Palmer Municipal



Airport and Mayor DeLena Johnson welcomed approximately 20 Aviation Enthusiasts from Manchester England with "The Aviation Society". The Aviation Society visits airports in Alaska every couple of years and Palmer is one of their preferred stops. They are particularly interested in our unique and historical aircraft located here. We have a 1944 DC 3 and two C-119's flown in World War II and a DC-4 that was flown in the Berlin Airlift at the beginning of

the Cold War" said airport manager, Frank Kelly. What else...? In the first week of June, New Horizons Telecommunications Inc. hosted the 24th annual FAA "Fly In" and breakfast program. Over 100 people attended the event with numerous pilots
