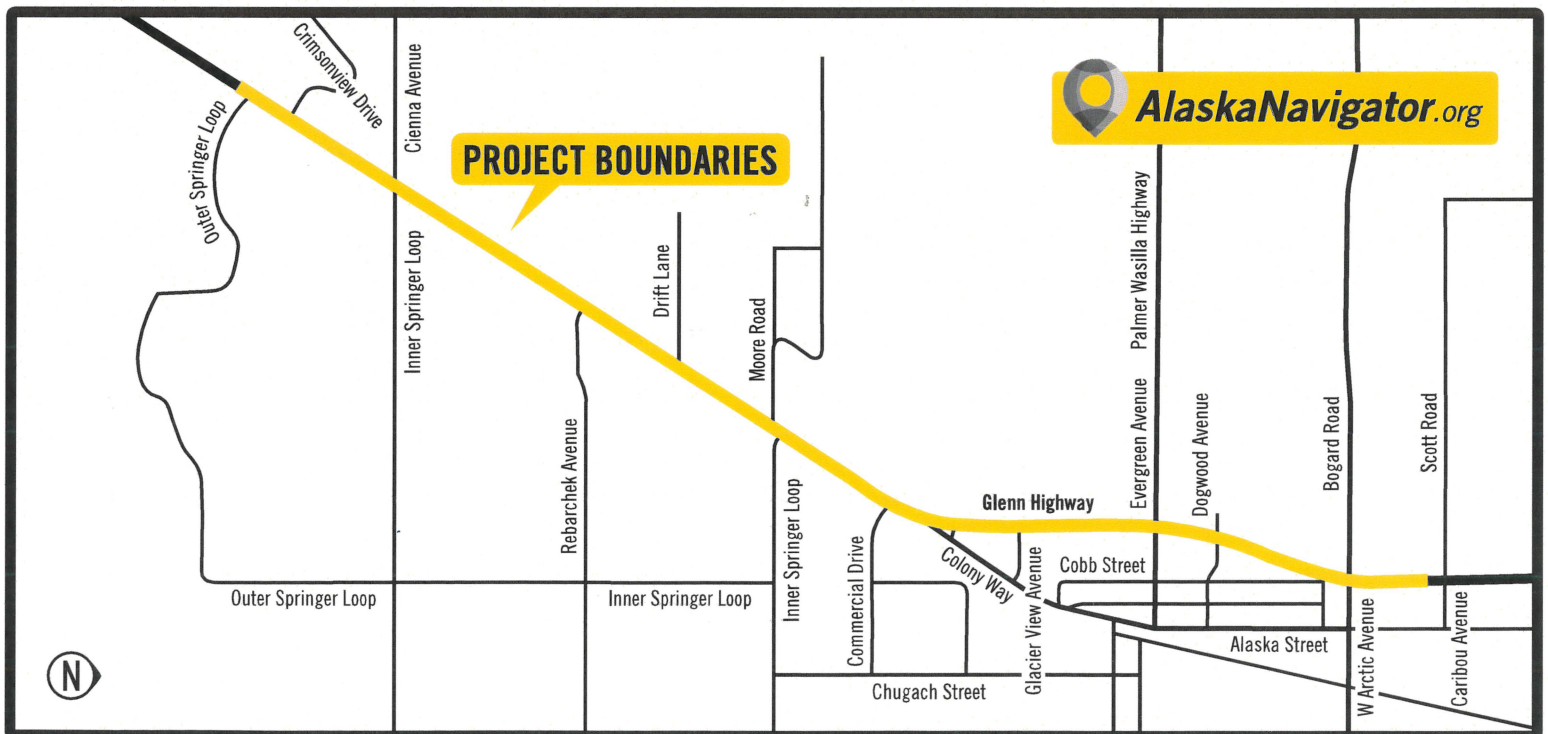


STATE OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION & PUBLIC FACILITIES

The Alaska Department of Transportation, in cooperation with QAP, is working to upgrade the Glenn Highway from South Inner Springer Loop to West Arctic Avenue from the existing two lane configuration to a four lane configuration as well as adding a continuous pedestrian pathway. Other project work will include installing four new traffic signals at the intersection of Evergreen Avenue and Cobb Street, Glenn Highway and Colony Way, Glenn Highway and East Inner Springer Loop, as well as Glenn Highway and South Inner Springer Loop. Construction crews will also be adding a frontage road from Glacier View Avenue to Cienna Avenue.

## CONSTRUCTION OVERVIEW:

- Project work in 2018 will include moving the utilities (phone, power, gas) to accommodate the new lane configuration and frontage road. Drivers should be aware of construction crews and equipment along the shoulder as well as clearing activities throughout the project boundaries.
- Project work in 2019 will include constructing the new embankment, installing traffic signals, and initial paving operations.
- Project work in 2020 will include finishing up paving operations and installation of final striping and signage.
