

PALMER POLICE PRESS RELEASES FOR OCTOBER 19-25, **2020**

On October 19, 2020, Palmer Police received a REDDI report of a driver almost causing a collision and crossing the center line several times on Alaska Street. Officers contacted MARK L. OSIECKI, age 60 of Palmer, who after an investigation was Summoned for Driving Under the Influence and Refusal to Submit to a Chemical Test.

On October 19, 2020, Palmer Police responded to a damage-only vehicle collision at S Cobb St & W Cottonwood Ave. The involved vehicles were operated by Kyle Reeder, age 20 of Palmer, and John Musgrove, age 69 of Palmer.
