

PALMER POLICE PRESS RELEASES FOR
May 30 – June 5, 2022

On May 31st, 2022 Palmer Police arrested AMBER J. PETERSON, age 28 of Wasilla, for two warrants of Failure to Comply with Conditions of Probation for the original charge of Assault 3rd, and Failure to Appear for the original charges of Disorderly Conduct, Criminal Trespass 2nd, and Resisting Arrest. PETERSON was remanded and bail was set at \$1200.00 per the warrants.

On May 31, 2022, Palmer Police issued a summons to JESSIE E. MILLER, age 37 of Palmer, for Criminal Trespass in the 2nd Degree. She was escorted off the premises and released on her own recognizance.

On June 1, 2022, Palmer Police forwarded charges to the District Attorney's Office on AMBER J. PETERSON age 28 of Wasilla for Theft 2.

On June 3, 2022, Palmer Police responded to a single vehicle accident near Mile 17 of the Old Glenn Highway. Subsequent investigation led to Palmer Police forwarding charges to the District Attorney's Office on JEREMY H. HARRIS, age 42 of Palmer, for Felony Driving Under the Influence, Driving While License Revoked, and Violation of Conditions of Release.

On June 3, 2022, Palmer Police responded to a four-vehicle collision in the parking lot of Palmer Fred Meyer involving VIOLET S. JAMISON, age 82 of Cantwell and CALEB R. YORK, age 25 of North Carolina. The collision also involved two unoccupied vehicles. Minor injuries were reported, and one person was transported by EMS. The investigation is ongoing.

On June 4, 2022, Palmer Police arrested TYRELL A. ADKINS, age 26 of Palmer, for Driving Under the Influence. ADKINS was issued a summons per the bail schedule and released.

On June 4, 2022, Palmer Police arrested THOMAS H. VANEECKHOUT, age 73 of Palmer, for Assault in the 4th Degree. He was remanded to Mat-Su Pretrial and held without bail until arraignments per Judge Bauer.

On June 5, 2022, Palmer Police responded to a two-vehicle collision on N. Gulkana St at Eklutna Avenue. The drivers were RAYMOND W. GAMRADT, age 39 of Palmer, and ERIN P. SIMPSON, age 41 of Palmer. Minor injuries were treated on scene by Emergency Medical Services.
